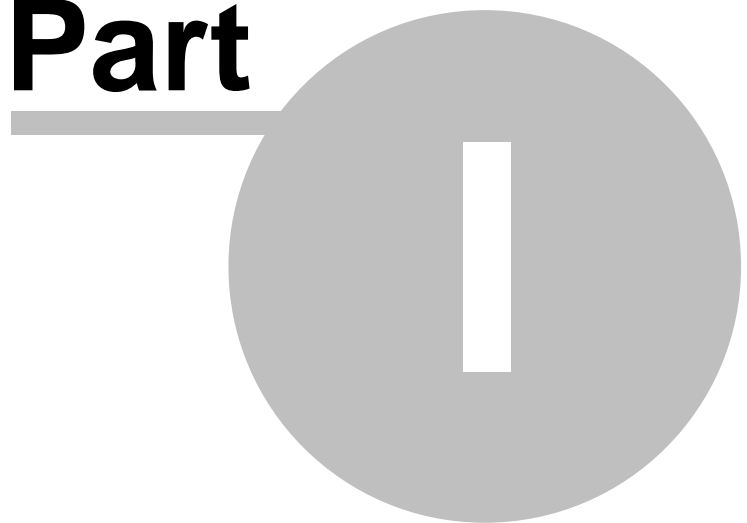

Chapter 1 - Ictips Window Fixer

1 Icetips Window Fixer

Welcome to Icetips Window Fixer

This documentation is for build 2021.06.157 released on June 7, 2021. Please refer to the "Support" tab on the templates and commented headers in the class files to verify that you have the correct documentation for the build that you are using.

Window Fixer:

- Makes sure that windows are not opened outside of the virtual screen
- Checks all available monitors to get the extent of the available screen coordinates.
- Optionally allows windows to extend over multiple monitors
- Optionally pulls windows to the nearest monitor so they are completely contained by that monitor
- Optionally allows specifying percent of windows area that can be outside of a monitor view.
- Works with Appframes, MDI and non-MDI windows.
- Works with both ABC and Clarion (Legacy) templates.
- Works with Clarion 6 and 7.

The Icetips Window Fixer is a set of templates and classes that checks window positions and sizes when windows are opened to make sure that they are visible. When window sizes and positions are set to save and restore in your application it can cause problems and it may place windows outside of the virtual screen, so the user cannot see the windows and thinks the program has crashed.

Note that the classes are NOT ABC compliant and can be used in any kind of projects, included purely handcoded projects.

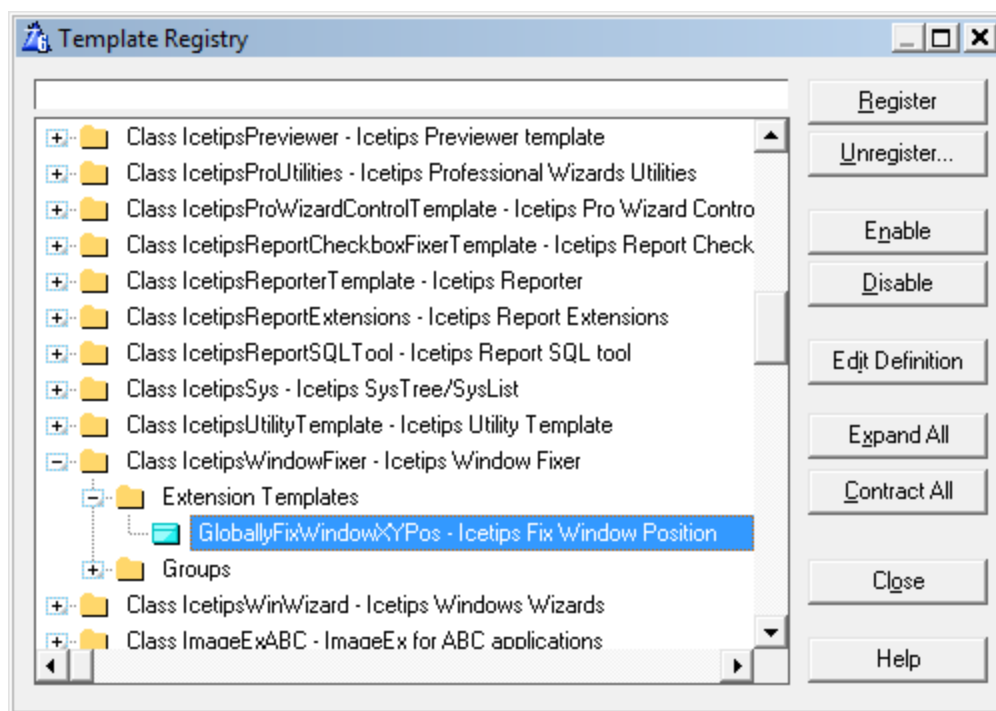

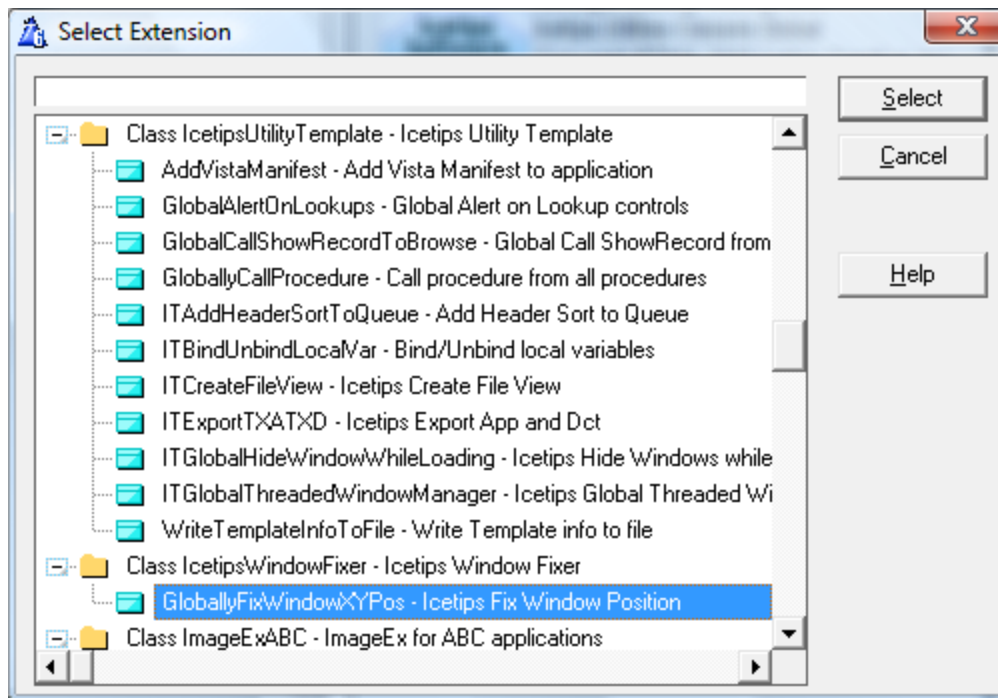

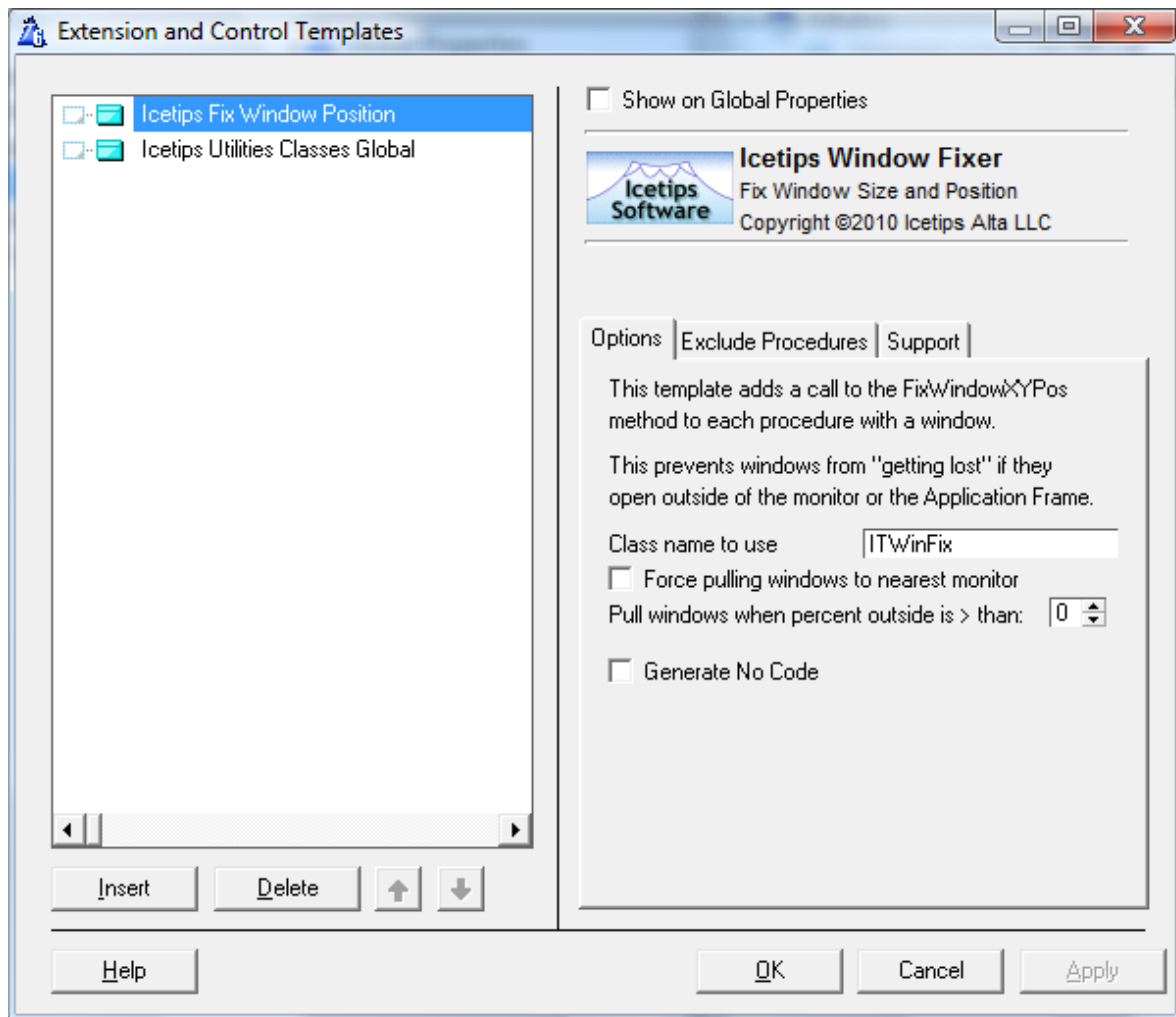
The Icetips Window Fixer is very simple to implement. A single Global extension template does all the work for you. Note that the template will only fix the window position when the window opens.

First make sure that the Icetips Window Fixer template is registered by opening the template registry.



Then open your application and add the global template.





Normally this is all you need!

Class name

You can change the name of the class that is instantiated in each window procedure in your application.

Force pulling windows to nearest monitor

You can also force windows to be pulled to the nearest monitor. This setting only applies to windows that are on one or more monitors. Windows that are partially outside of the virtual screen area will always be pulled in.

Pull windows when percent outside is > than

You can set a percent value so that if x% or more is outside of the monitor(s) viewable area, the window will be pulled in. For example if you set it to 25% then any window that has more than 25% of its rectangle outside of the virtual screen will be pulled in to be fully visible on the nearest monitor. Note that this option is only applicable when the "Force pulling windows to nearest monitor" is unchecked. If it is checked, windows are always pulled in.

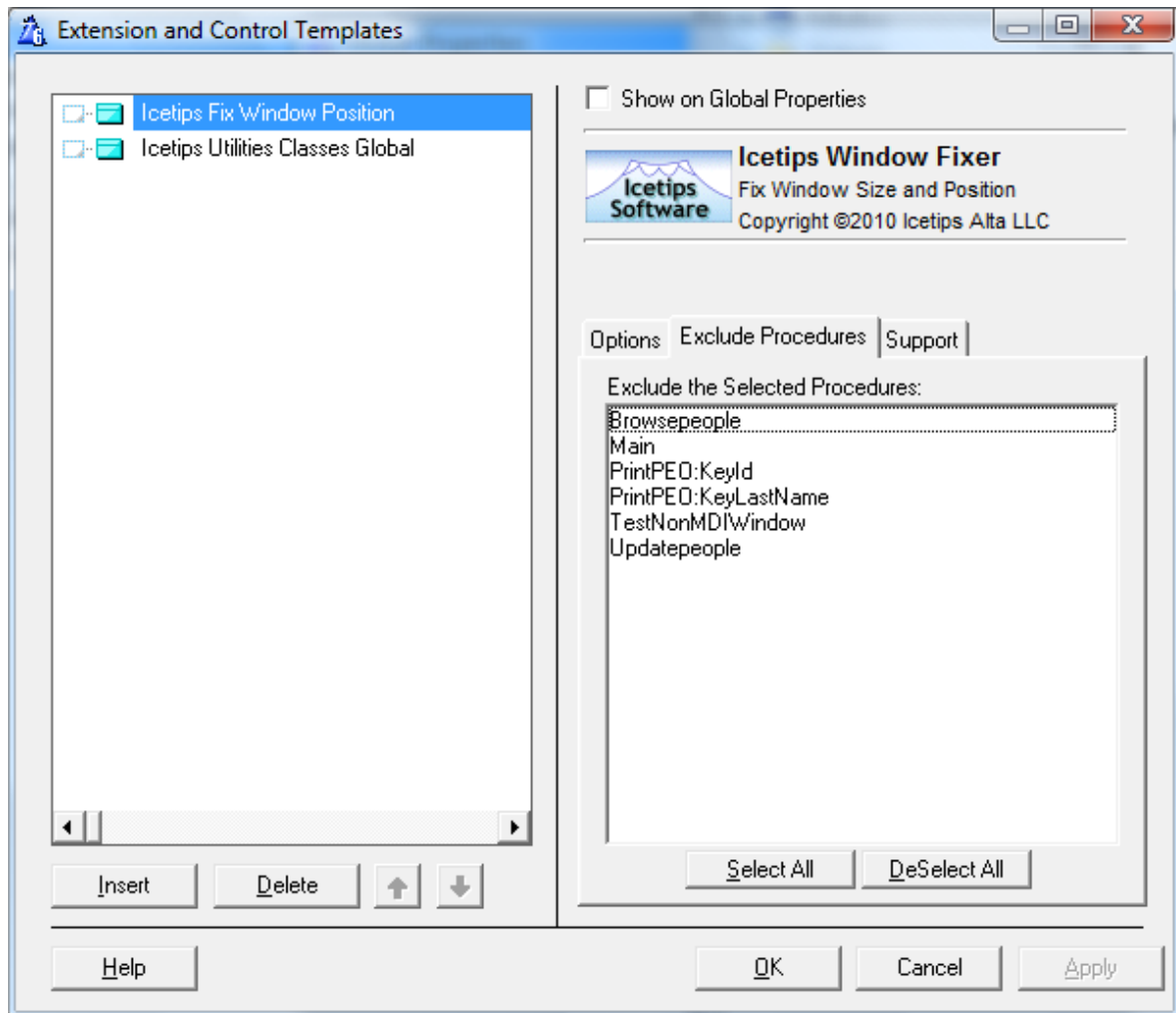
Generate No Code

You can optionally check the "Generate No Code" and then the template will not generate any code at

all in your application.

Exclude Procedures

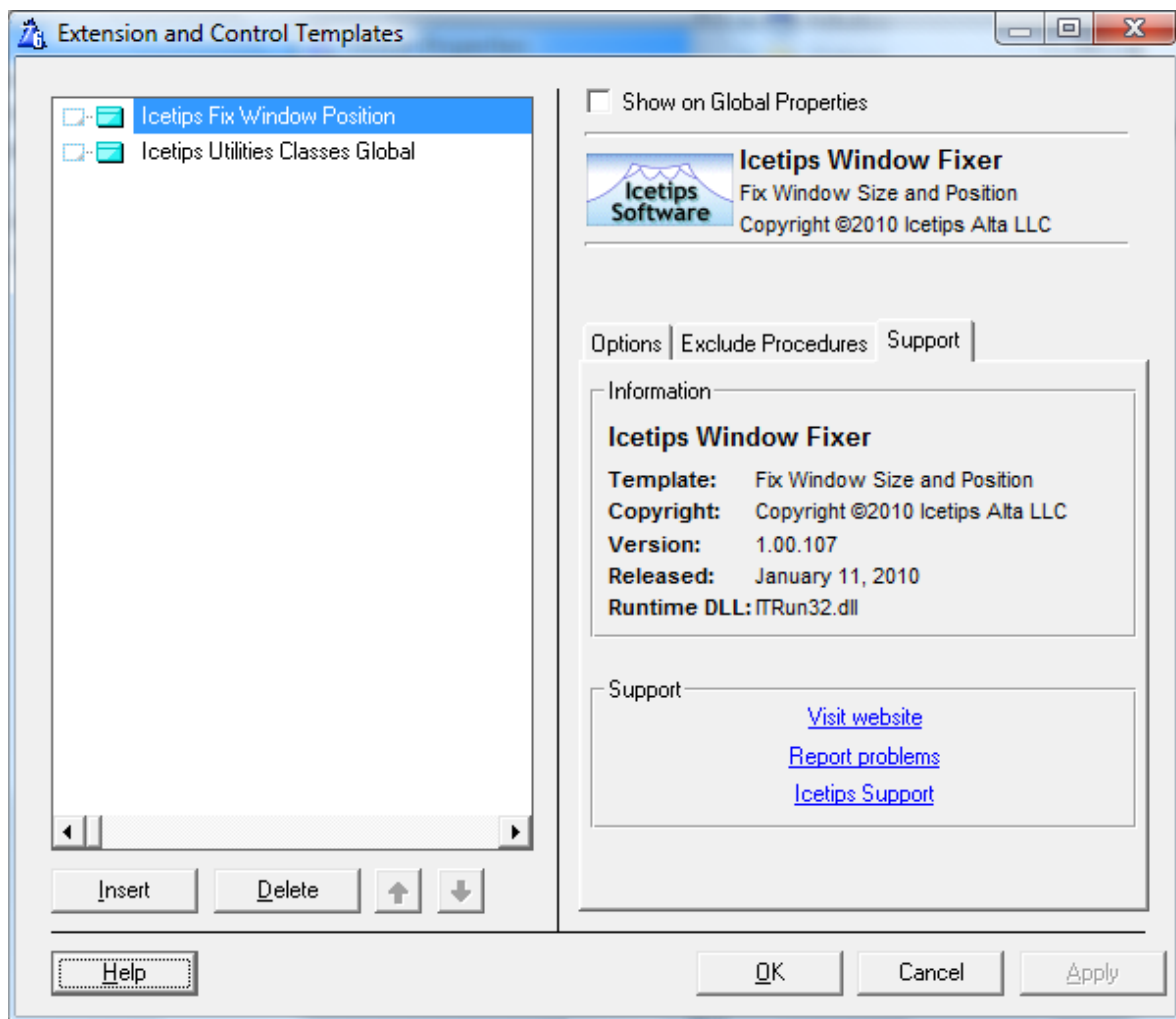
On the "Exclude Procedures" you can select procedures that you do not want to apply this template to.



To exclude a procedure, simply click once on the list of procedures. Click again to unselect.

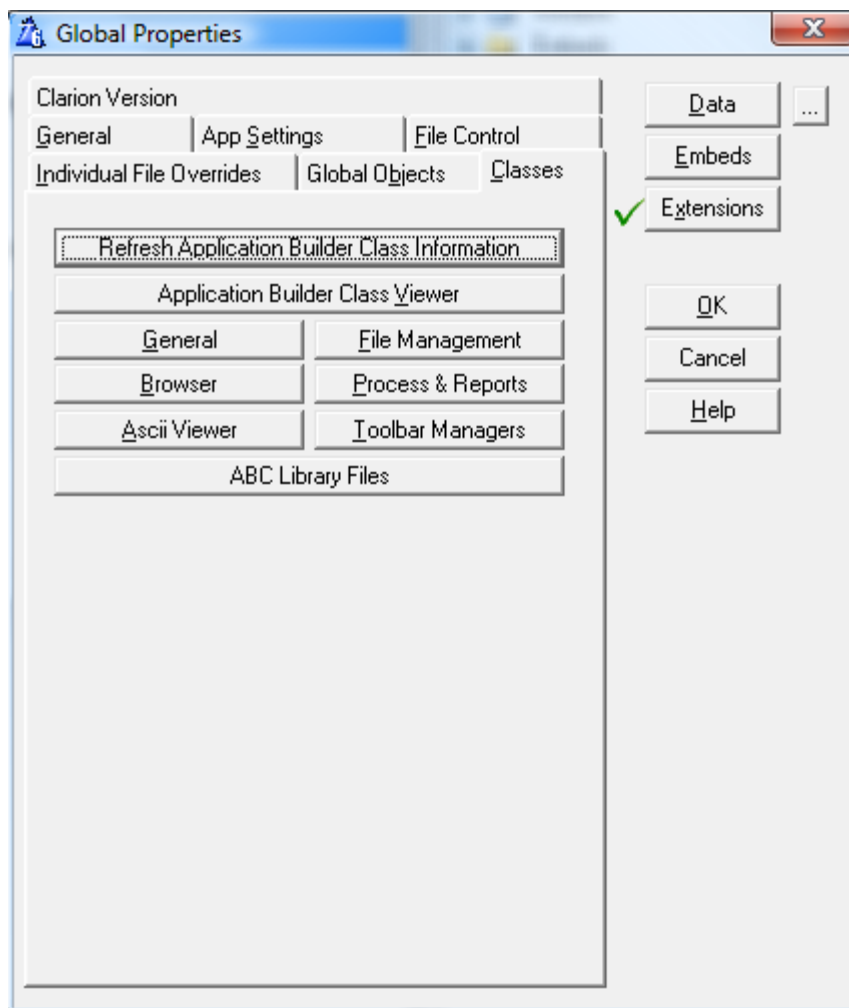
1.2.1.1 Force Appframe to correct monitor

User Reference - Using the template

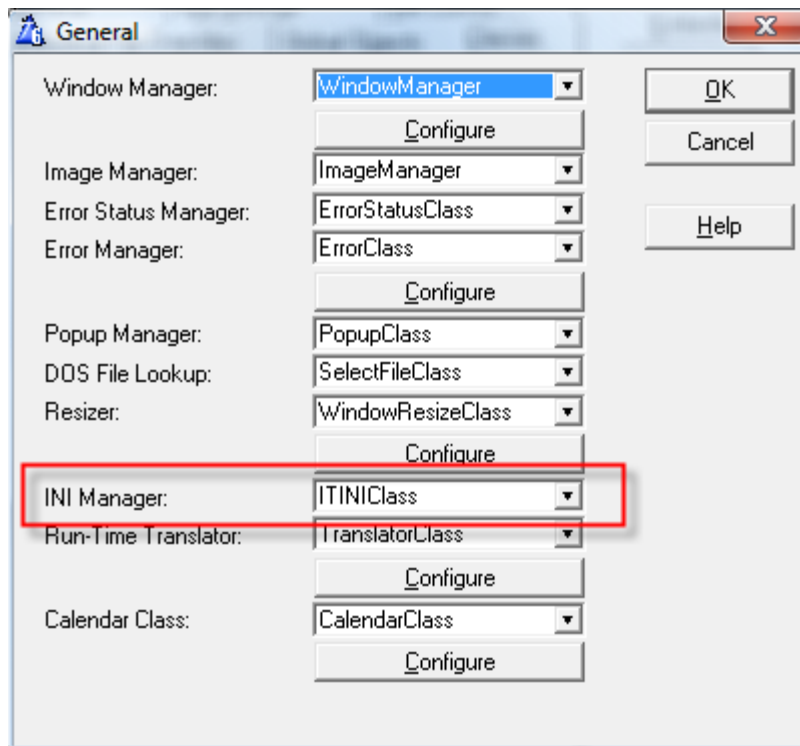
By default both the ABC and Clarion (Legacy) templates and classes don't save the X and Y coordinates of the application frame window **if it is maximized**. This causes the appframe to open up on the primary monitor which may or may not be the monitor that it was open on when the appframe was closed. This can easily cause confusion and annoyance when the appframe will not open on the correct monitor. Below are very simple methods that you can use to fix this problem. One involves using our derived ITINIClass in your ABC application instead of the INIClass. The other one involves writing some very simple code in your Clarion (Legacy) application.

ABC

If you have Icetips Utilities build 1.1.2355 or later and you are working with ABC applications you can optionally also add the Utilities to the application and change the INI manager class to use the one provided by the Icetips Utilities. This build (2355) includes new method for the INI class that fixes a problem with the application frame window not being opened on the correct monitor if it was closed maximized.



Go to the Global | Classes section and click on the "General" tab.



Then drop the list down for the INI Manager and select the ITINIClass instead of the INIClass. Your application frame is now fixed and it will always open on the same monitor that it was closed on.

Clarion (Legacy)

For Clarion (Legacy) applications this is a little trickier. You will have to write some code to omit the generated code that closes the window and duplicate it with some additional code.

Note that the saving of the window position and closing of the window is omitted and then duplicated. You then need to save the X and Y positions of the appframe procedure to wherever it is supposed to be saved - in this case an INI file in the application folder. Since Legacy does not allow much flexibility in this regard I'm afraid it will have to be up to you to implement this code, at least for now. For ABC applications

1.2.1.2 Multi DLL considerations

Multi DLL considerations.

If your application is a multi-dll application you must apply the Icetips Window Fixer template to the application that exports file declarations (base dll/exporting dll) so the class definitions are exported correctly. You do need to add the Icetips Window Fixer template to all of your applications in the multi-dll system if you want all your windows to behave the same way.

1.2.2.1 ShowAllWindows

User Reference - Class reference

ShowAllWindows Byte

If this is TRUE before the call to the FixWindowXYPos method it will force the class to pull the window in so that it is 100% visible on one monitor no matter what. This will force windows that are partially on one monitor and partially on another (but the whole window is visible) to be pulled in to the nearest monitor. The monitor that has the highest percentage of the total area of the window rectangle (i.e. > 50.0000%) will get the entire window.

If this is FALSE, then only windows that are < 100% will be pulled into the nearest monitor. Windows that are 100% visible, even if they are on multiple monitors, will be left where they are. However if ShowMinPercent is not equal to zero then it will be used to compare with the visibility percent of the window to decide if it should be pulled into its nearest monitor.

1.2.2.2 ShowMinPercent

User Reference - Class reference

ShowMinPercent Decimal(7,4)

Can be used when ShowAllWindows is FALSE to determine how much area of a window can be outside of the virtual screen of combined monitors. For example if this is set to 25 then 25% of any given window can be outside of the virtual screen. If more than 25% is outside the virtual screen, then the window will be pulled in so that it is 100% visible.

1.2.2.3 FixWindowXYPos

FixWindowXYPos Procedure

This is where all the magic happens! You can call this method at any time and it will check your window position and move it to where it should be. The template calls this method only when the window opens, after it's position has been modified by the "Save and Restore Window Location" options in the ABC and Clarion (Legacy) templates.

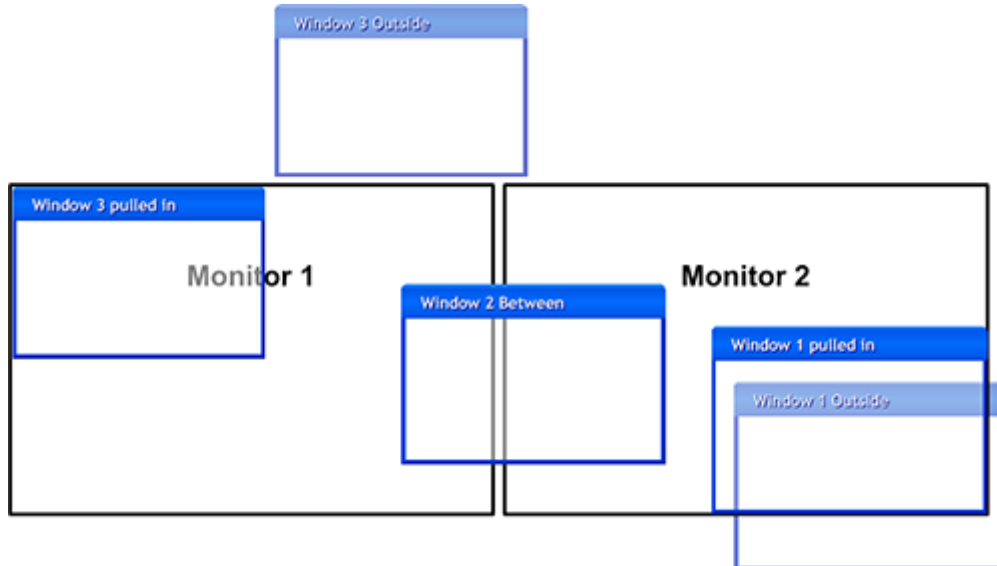
This method works on Appframe, MDI and Non-MDI windows. Windows are NOT resized by the

window fixer, only moved.

Appframe windows are placed on the monitor that they belong to or has the highest percentage of the window. Appframe windows are always placed in relation to the screen, i.e. in screen coordinates.

MDI windows are pulled into the appframe client area and the general rule is that the upper left corner is visible. If the window is larger than the appframe's client area then the window will be placed in position 0,0 in the upper left corner of the client area. If the window is too wide, the window will be placed at X position 0. If the window is too tall, then it will be placed at Y position 0. MDI windows are always placed in relation to their parent window (appframe) location, i.e. in client coordinates.

Non-MDI windows are pulled into the monitor visible rectangle. This takes into account the size and location of the taskbar on the primary monitor and also if the taskbar is set to auto-hide or not. On other monitors the full monitor rectangle is used. If a window is partially outside of a monitor, the ShowAllWindows and ShowMinPercent properties dictate how the window is handled. If the window is completely outside the virtual screen it will always be pulled in to be visible on the nearest monitor. If the window is inside the virtual screen area, but is visible on more than one monitor, the ShowAllWindows tells how to handle it. If it is true, then the window is placed on the monitor that has the highest percent of the window visible on it. If ShowAllWindows is false, then the window is left where it is. If the window is partially outside of the virtual screen then it will be pulled in unless ShowAllWindows is false. Then it is up to the ShowMinPercent value to determine how much of the window can be outside of the virtual screen. If it is 0, then none of the window can be outside and it will be pulled in - this setting works like when ShowAllWindows is set to True. If ShowMinPercent is set to 25% then that means that up to 25% of the total window area can be outside the virtual screen. If more than 25% is outside, the window will be pulled in so that it is completely visible. Non-MDI windows are always placed in relation to the screen, i.e. in screen coordinates.



This image shows 3 windows on two same sized monitors. **Window 1** is partially outside the virtual screen in the bottom, right corner. It will be pulled up and to the left so that it is 100% visible. If ShowAllWindows is false and ShowMinPercent is set to 50%, then the window would be left where it is since there is more than 50% of the window visible on the virtual screen. **Window 2** is visible on both monitors. If ShowAllWindows is set to True, then this window would be pulled into Monitor 2, since it has more than 50% of the window rectangle on it. **Window 3** is completely outside both monitors and will always be pulled into Monitor 1 as it is the nearest one and placed at coordinates 0,0.

Following is a simple example of how to use the Icetips Window Fixer in a hand coded project. There are also 3 example applications and projects shipped with the product. If you need further assistance, please do not hesitate to ask for help and support:)

1.2.3.1 Using in handcoded projects**User Reference - Examples**

It is easy to use the Window fixer in a hand coded project.

First you need to add two lines to the project file:

```
_ITFixWinDllMode_=>0
_ITFixWinLinkMode_=>1
```

This is for stand alone exe or a base dll exporting declarations. For anything else use:

```
_ITFixWinDllMode_=>1
_ITFixWinLinkMode_=>0
```

You need to include the class in your global module:

```
Include('ITFixWindowClass.inc'),ONCE
```

You can now instanciate the class and use it anywhere in your project:
